DoDDS Korea is pleased to announce Dr. Marguerite Green as the new principal of CT Joy Elementary/Middle School. Dr. Marguerite Green was born in London, Ontario, Canada and attended school there from Kindergarten to Grade 8. She moved to Arcadia, California where she attended junior high and high school. After graduation, she returned to Canada where she became a professional musician (violinist) for a brief time, returning to the United States to attend college.

After the birth of her first son, she became a United States citizen. In 1977 she graduated from California Polytechnic State University in San Luis Obispo California, with a Bachelor's of Art Degree in Liberal Studies. She received her Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction in 1982 with a specialization in Special Education. In 2002, she received her Doctorate Degree in Educational Leadership from Capella University in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Dr. Green began her education career as an instructional aide in 1972. She began her teaching career in 1982 with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Western Navajo Nation, Tuba City, Arizona. She taught high school for the BIA for 2 years and then became an Education Specialist for the Western Navajo Nation.

In 1986 Dr. Green began teaching for Mohave Union High School in Kingman, Arizona. From 1990 to 1996 she served as the Director of Special Education. From 1996-1997 Dr. Green taught Grades 4-8 in a small rural country school in northern Arizona.

In 1997 Dr. Green began her administrative career as she became the assistant principal for Dolan Spring Elementary School, Chloride School District, a rural K-8 school in northern Arizona. In 1998 she became the principal of Hackberry Elementary School District, a small K-8 rural school also in northern Arizona.

In 2000 Dr. Green retired from Arizona and began her career with the Department of Defense. She taught Special Education, Grade 3, and Sure Start in Darmstadt, Germany. In 2003 Dr. Green became the assistant principal at Daegu American School. Dr Green is certified to teach K-8, preschool, compensatory education, reading K-12, and all areas and levels of Special Education.

Dr. Green has 3 sons and 2 grandchildren.

When asked about her new position, Dr. Green stated, "I am extremely excited to have been selected and I look forward to working in the Chinhae community."
